

Lights, Camera, Action, Water! By Val Sleger

Read just about any article Google serves up for you on the topic of photography and the subject of light will be in the top paragraphs. Without light, we would not be able to make photos. Often, we work with natural light. We may seek out the "golden hour" or the "blue hour". We might compose pictures in front of a window. We might use a neutral density filter if outdoor light is too harsh.

On the flip side, there is a lot we can do with artificial light. Whether that light comes from flash, from candles, from LED devices, or from iPad screens, we often have far more control over artificial light than we do over natural light.

As we head into the hot and (hopefully rainy) summer season, you may be looking for photography projects you can do indoors. At this month's meeting, you'll get lots of ideas to jump-start your summer photo sessions and get some practice before you head home.

This month's meeting will be a hands-on session with a variety of opportunities to play with artificial light. **Bring your camera or smartphone.** If you have one, bring a tripod. Bring a flashlight. If you have an off-camera flash unit, bring that. Jon and I will supply the presentation, the instructions, and some props. Then we'll all have a chance to experiment with different artificial light sources. It should be fun!

Why is Water included in the headline? Come to the meeting and find out!

When Joyce distributes the meeting minutes, I'll have her include a page of links to the tutorials and articles I used to build the presentation and practice lessons you'll see at the June meeting. Hope to see you all there!


